Each year, School Council reviews these to decide on projects that will be funded by the school and Parents Group fundraising efforts. Previous projects include The Lab, reading resources, synthetic oval and play equipment. Please email your suggestions by 1 March to the school email, with Priority Projects in the subject line.

Thank you to all those parents who attended **Parent Information** and **Meet the Teacher** sessions over the last two weeks. This was an opportunity to understand what is happening in Junior School, Middle School or Senior School, as well as meet your child's teachers and share important information.

We introduced the school's new website and outlined **communication plans** that School Council has been developing. This newsletter outlines some of the other channels we use for communicating with parents.

The Parent Information Evenings this week were the first of our 'formal' meetings with, and reports to, parents. We schedule these so there is at least one opportunity every term to know how your child is progressing and the next steps in their learning, as follows:

- Term 1 Information Evenings (Week 3).
- Term 1 Meet the Teacher (Week 4)
- Term 2 and 4: Semester reports are sent home at the end of each term.
- Early Term 3: parent teacher meetings are held again. Parents will be advised of actual dates.

Additionally, parents of children with special needs or short-term challenges can expect:

- Individual Learning Plans (ILPs), which are updated every five weeks if needed; or
- Behaviour Support Plans (BSPs), which are reviewed each term; or
- Student Support Group meetings once each term.

- For more serious issues regarding your child's learning, safety or wellbeing, and after speaking with their teacher, please contact the PLC Leader or one of our Leading Teachers/Learning Specialists (Mandy, Glenda, Jacqui or Narelle).
- If these steps do not resolve your concerns or questions, or for matters concerning the operation of the school, please contact Kathy Verbi, Jo Braden or me.

To **arrange a meeting or conversation** with your child's teacher, or appointments with other staff, please email the school or phone our office. Of course, you can always touch base with your child's teacher briefly at 8:50 am.

As your child's teacher is working with children for most of their day, email response times can be typically 24 - 48 hours. The secure school email address laburnum.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au is checked several times daily and important messages are conveyed to teachers. If your child's teacher is absent on a day you email the school, messages can be passed onto the replacement teacher or PLC Leader if needed.

Although the school's Communication strategy and platforms will be updated further this year, we currently continue to use the newsletter, Skoolbag app, website, emails and Sentral Parent Portal for important messages or documents.

Sentral contains documents and messages for parents. The updated version of the 'A - Z of Useful Information' for parents is available on the school website [here](#), or on Sentral. We urge parents to read the handbook and, in particular, new families should find this document useful. Year level blogs are not operating until further notice.

Relevant school policies are uploaded to the website as they are ratified by School Council and can be accessed on the website under 'Our School'.

Finally, Kathy, Jo and I are always available to meet with you or discuss concerns; please call our office so we can set aside uninterrupted time for you.

This newsletter also includes an updated list of **extra-curricular activities** for Term 1. Thanks to the teachers and parents who organise these.

New timetable

So far, our new timetable is working well and all students are participating in all specialist areas.

As we are trialling the timetable this semester, lunch eating time has moved to the earlier time of 11:00. This is the preferred option in other primary schools using the same timetable. Many classes also have brain breaks or snack breaks at other times during the day.

Students continue to have ten minutes to eat lunch with their class, as has been the case at LPS for many years. Students in Prep have much longer than ten minutes as they are still settling into school routines.

As in previous years, there is an arrangement in each year level if there are any students who need or want additional time to eat.

Students can still take 'nude food' into the playground, although lunch containers remain inside.

Our teachers will continue to monitor this arrangement.

Skills students focused on building strong interpersonal skills including paraphrasing, empathic listening, perspective taking and objectivity. 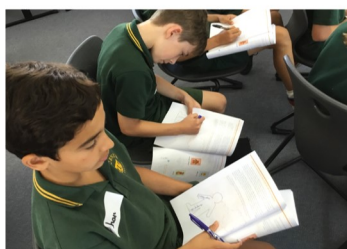

I also authorise the Australian Government Department of Human Services (DHS) to provide the results of that enquiry to DET.

I understand that:

- DHS will use information I have provided to DET to confirm my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund and will disclose to DET personal information including my name, address, payment and concession card type and status.
 - this consent, once signed, remains valid while my child is enrolled at a registered Victorian school unless I withdraw it by contacting the school.
 - I can obtain proof of my circumstances/details from DHS and provide it to DET so that my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund can be determined.
 - if I withdraw my consent or do not alternatively provide proof of my circumstances/details, I may not be eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provided by DET.
 - Information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services and /or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.
- You are able to request access to the personal information that we hold about you, and to request that any errors be corrected, by contacting your child's school.

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;
 - a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004*, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (28 January 2020) or term two (14 April 2020).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2020 closes on 26 June, 2020.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

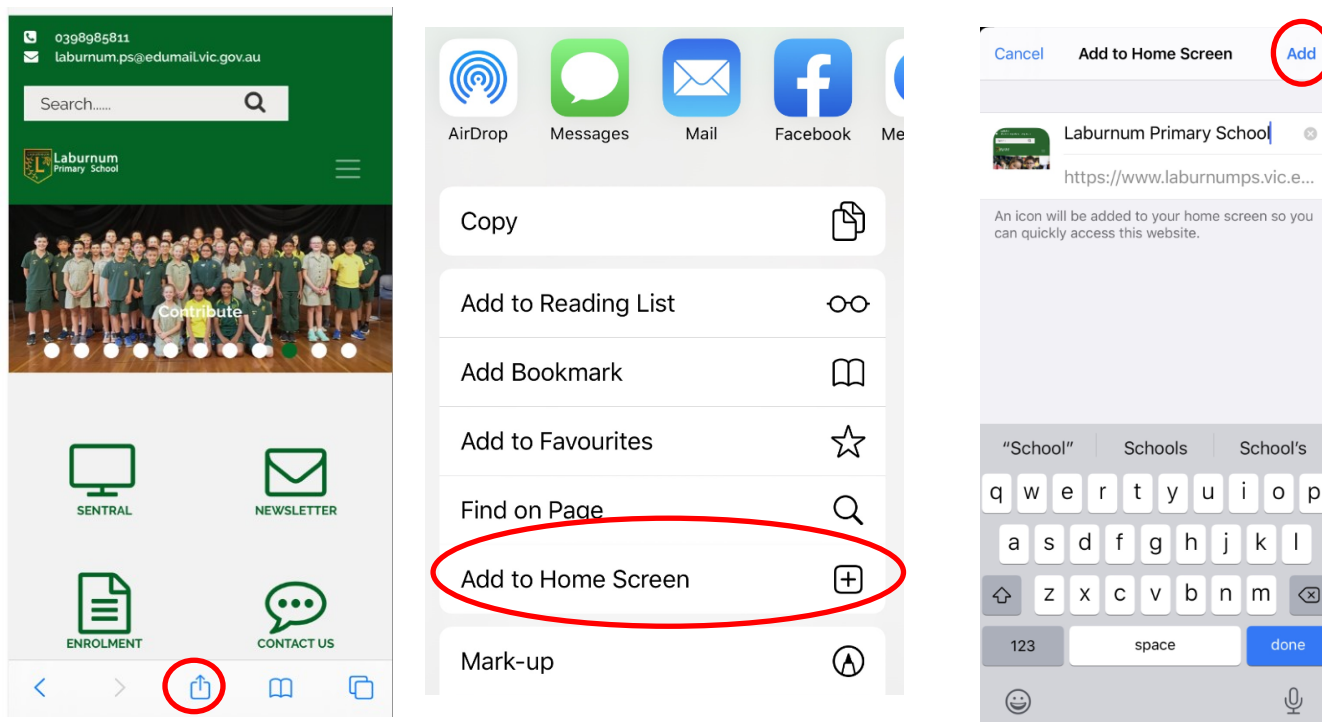

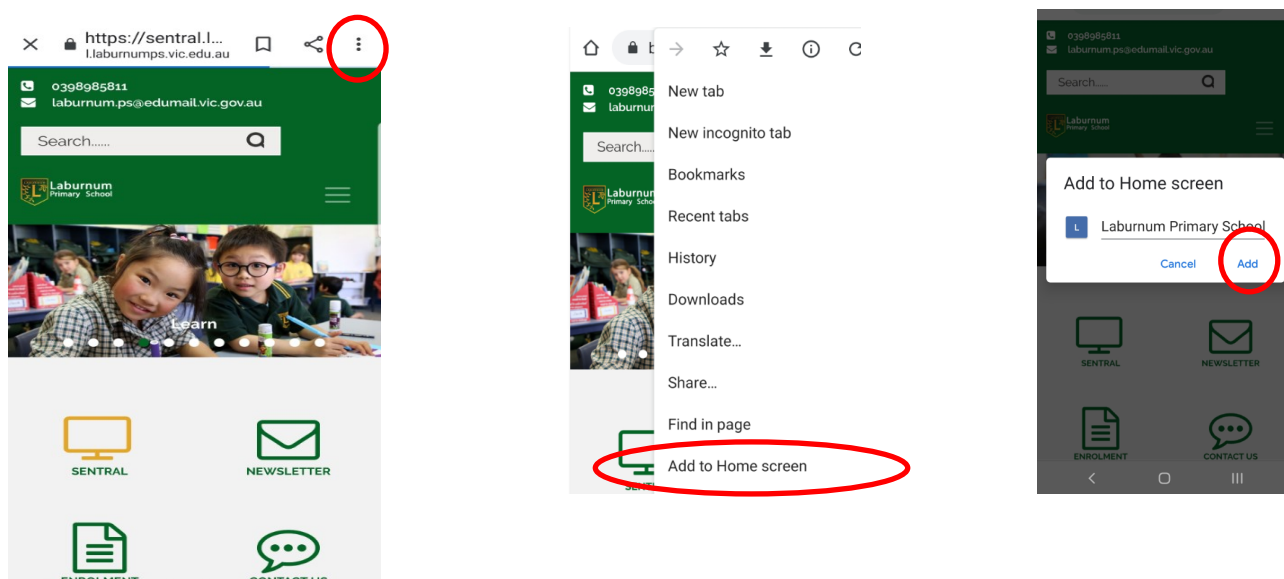
Save this to your home screen by:

Lost Property

Did you know that we have a lost property stand? Any lost property we find during OSHC hours we place on our hanging stand, or in one of the crates at the bottom. On a Friday, any items that are named will go to the school office, while unnamed items will remain at OSHC. At the end of each term we will donate any clothing items that are not school branded to a local op shop.

OSHClub Sunsmart Policy

When the UV is above 3, OSHClub will remind children to wear their hats when playing outside. Please make sure your child brings a hat to the OSHClub program. OSHClub has a "No hat- No outside play" policy (when the UV is above 3). OSHClub also provides sun cream. If your child is allergic to a particular type of sun cream, please inform the coordinator (Mary) at the program.

Casual attendance at OSHC

Did you know that you can arrange 'on the day' bookings by calling the OSHC phone? At OSHClub we understand that sometimes unforeseen events occur, which may leave you unable to collect your child from school. Our priority is to provide a safe and stimulating environment for your child, whether they are booked in advance, or simply attend on the day. Casual bookings do incur an additional charge, so it's often easier to set up regular bookings using the website.

If you need to make an 'on-the-day' booking, you can call or text the OSHC phone on 0413 227 071 for Before or After School Care bookings.

A casual booking is defined as one that is made within 24 hours of the start of the session (7am for BSC, 3:30pm for ASC).

Please give us as much notice as possible, as there have been situations where we have had to refuse care due to insufficient space (i.e. by accepting your child we would be in breach of our licence or the National Regulations, so do not have the power to reverse a decision).

Medical conditions- expiry dates alert!

If your child has a medical condition (e.g. asthma, allergies or anaphylaxis), we must have their medication here at OSHC at the time of their attendance, or we will be unable to accept them (and you will need to collect them from the school office). Most families keep their medication here for convenience, however if you choose to sign in/ sign out medication, it is your responsibility to ensure the medication doesn't expire.

If your child's medication is stored here at OSHClub, I will ensure it remains within date, and inform you if it is due to expire (generally 1 month's notice).

Thanks for your understanding- this process is to ensure that your child remains safe and cared for while attending OSHClub. If you have any questions about this, feel free to drop in for a chat.

Cancellation Policy- BSC and ASC

I have had a few questions about our cancellation policy which I have detailed below. Different criteria apply depending on when you cancel.

1. Cancellations made within 48 hours of session beginning (7am / 3:30pm)

If you give less than 48 hours notice of a cancellation, you will be charged the full cost of the session. This is to cover the costs of additional staffing (if required) and food or art supplies that will be used that session.

2. Cancellations made more than 48 hours prior to session beginning

If you give 48 hours notice when cancelling a session, you will not be charged for that session. You will need to log into your iParent Portal account to cancel, or SMS 0413 227 071.

For more information about our cancellation policy, feel free to drop in for a chat.

Upcoming Student free Day- Friday 6th March

Consider this your advance notice that OSHClub anticipates running a full day program on Friday 6th March. We have had amazing attendance at our previous programs and look forward to seeing a lot of you on this date. We will require a minimum number of children to attend to run this day, so please ensure you book asap.

Extracurricular Activities
